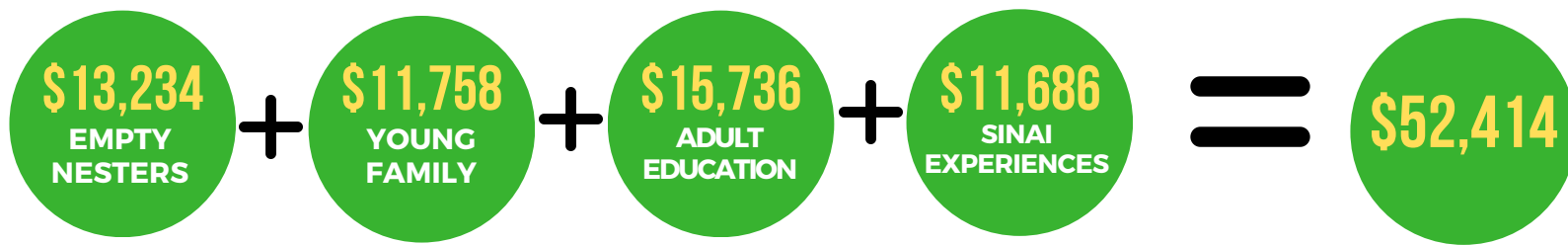

# RABBI RICHARD ADDRESS, SCHOLAR-IN-RESIDENCE, AND THE ISAAC MAYER WISE AWARD RABBI RICK RHEINS

## Temple Sinai is thrilled to host Rabbi Richard Address as our Scholar-in-Residence from January 19-21!

Rabbi Richard Address has devoted much of his career as a leader of Reform Judaism. For many years he was a Regional Director and then, in 1997, he founded and became director of the Department of Jewish Family Concerns for the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ). His most recent work as the Founder and Director of Jewish Sacred Aging exemplifies his commitment to serving the Jewish community and providing inspiring guidance for Jewish families. During his time with us, Rabbi Address will offer our Temple Sinai members his wise advice and experience through special programs and presentations. Those of you who have had the joy of attending a class or session led by Rabbi Address know that he provides life-affirming lessons with candor, wisdom, and great humor.

In recognition of his lifetime of leadership, we are honored to award Rabbi Address with the prestigious Isaac Mayer Wise Award.

In 1983, Temple Sinai and Congregation Emanuel created the Isaac Mayer Wise Award to be presented to those who have made significant contributions to the development of Reform Judaism and the Jewish people. This award is given in recognition of the distinguished service, inspiring efforts, and extraordinary accomplishments of those who have championed Progressive Jewish ideals of faith, scholarship, egalitarian inclusiveness, and love of Israel. It is named in honor of the founder of Reform Judaism in America, Isaac Mayer Wise. He devoted his life to creating institutions that would further the cause of Reform Judaism. He established a Judaism that was fully modern, yet authentically faithful to the fundamental principles of our Jewish faith and heritage. A man of tremendous energy and vision, Wise was the founder of the three major institutions of the Reform Movement – Hebrew Union College, the Reform movement's seminary, the Central Conference of American Rabbis, our movement's Rabbinic organization, and the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, the congregational arm of the movement which is now called the URJ, the Union For Reform Judaism.

Past recipients of this award include Alexander Schindler, Al Vorspan, Joseph Glaser, David Saperstein, Jacob Rader Marcus, Herbert Bronstein, Gunther Plaut, Alfred Gottschalk, Lydia Kukoff, Debbie Friedman, Rachel Cowan, Daniel Frelander, Ray Zwerin, Steve Foster, Anat Hoffman, Mark Washofsky, and Gary Zola. This year's honoree, Richard Address, is especially worthy of being included on this illustrious list.

In our respective congregations you will find two identical stained glass art pieces by the artist Irene Stein to commemorate this award. Ours at Temple Sinai is in the hallway just outside the new Youth Lounge and Abrahams Family Chapel at Temple Sinai. In the days and years to come, I hope you will find yourself near these awesome works of art, pause, and take note of the meaning and purpose of this Isaac Mayer Wise Award---and of the outstanding men and women who have earned our praise and our deepest, and most profound, appreciation and respect.

At the Erev Shabbat service on Friday, January 19 (6:00pm) the clergy from Temple Emanuel will join our Temple Sinai clergy on the bimah in the Zwerin Sanctuary to honor Rabbi Address. Members of both congregations will come together to worship, learn, and celebrate the vibrancy and blessings of Reform Judaism. I hope that you will be able to join us for the service and for the other opportunities to meet and learn from Rabbi Address.

# THE THEOLOGY OF “UH-OH”: RABBI RICHARD ADDRESS AND THE SACRED MESSINESS OF LIFE RABBI MICHAEL SHIELDS

I was nervous as it was my first time leading High Holy Days. But it was supposed to be relatively simple – a flight, a drive, and lead Rosh Hashanah Services. Then, rinse, repeat, and return for Yom Kippur.

Almost immediately upon arrival though, I found myself walking into the local hospital to be with a family. They were facing the prospect of removing life support from their loved one.

There had been no class for this thus far in Rabbinical school, and as I furiously thumbed through my rabbi's manual searching for the correct prayer or poem, or reading, I realized I was at a loss. There were sections for Birth, conversion, marriage, healing, and finally, mourning. "It should be here," I said, as I turned page after page. "Where is the ceremony or service for removing someone from life support?" It did not exist....yet.

In that moment, I did the best I could. I hope in my pre-rabbinical stumbling I brought some comfort to the family.

Flash-forward two years to the New York campus. I transferred to enroll in the Education Masters program. It was during my time in New York that I first met Rabbi Richard Address.

In 1999, the UAHC (now, URJ) created the Department of Family Concerns (full resolution), of which Rabbi Address was the Founder and Director. In that resolution, it stated the following: Recognizing that the family in all of its unique and different configurations is still a cornerstone and strength of the Jewish people and of our congregations, and coupled with the belief that our faith to be relevant and meaningful, must address itself to these very real life problems of our congregants, the UAHC has created the Department of Jewish Family Concerns. These real life problems included addressing special needs, mental health, adolescent self-destructive behaviors, suicide, mourning, support for caregivers, sacred aging and more.

Rabbi Address also taught a class each semester at Hebrew Union College. These classes turned out to be core material for my future rabbinate, and I finally found the section on removing someone from life support because one of our assignments was to create a ritual for a situation that did not have one. In partnership with a classmate we created a ritual for that moment when a person is removed from life support.

That assignment empowered me. We can and must create ritual for moments that demand ritual. The needs of our congregants and households have changed, and therefore our rituals must also grow and evolve. It also instilled in me the great honor and responsibility it is to walk with people as Rabbi Address often says "through the sacred messiness of life."

Rabbi Address and his Department of Family Concerns, which unfortunately no longer exists, deserves a lot of credit for the many new sections that have been added to the official Reform Movement Rabbi's Manual. Here are just some of the new additions that were added:

- Making an End of Life Decision
- Miscarriage, Experiencing Infertility
- Before an Organ Transplant
- Experiencing an Assault
- Separation
- Premature Birth
- Mourning Prayer For a Parent Who Was Hurtful
- Gender-Neutral Call to the Torah
- Accepting Tzedakah/Food Assistance
- Moving in Together
- Entering an Assisted Living or a Care Facility

Rabbi Address will be here in just a few short weeks and I ask you to attend as many sessions as you can so we can deepen our understanding of and increase the ways in which we care for one another. You can find the schedule in this edition of the Keshet.

As we turn from 2023 to 2024 I am hopeful. I also carry some anxieties and fears into this secular New Year. And Lo, I looked to the new supplement to the Rabbi's manual and found this prayer:

**Fear lurks**  
**In the dark corners of our hearts,**  
**Waiting to convince us**  
**That love will fail.**  
**Sorrow lurks**  
**In the dark corners of our souls,**  
**Waiting to convince us**  
**That faith will fail.**  
**Doubt lurks**  
**In the dark corners of our minds,**  
**Waiting to convince us**  
**That wisdom will fail.**

**Rock of Jacob,**  
**Teach us to shine**  
**The light of mitzvot**  
**Into the dark corners of our minds,**  
**So that we face our fears with courage,**  
**Redeeming them with awe and wonder.**  
**Song of Miriam,**  
**Teach us to shine**  
**The light of t'filot**  
**Into the dark corners of our souls,**  
**So that we face our sorrows with strength,**  
**Redeeming them with righteousness.**  
**God of old,**  
**Teach us to shine**  
**The light of Torah**  
**Into the darkness of our minds,**  
**So that we face our doubts with honor,**  
**Redeeming them with holiness.**

I wish all a hopeful New Year filled with new possibilities, healing, wholeness, and peace.

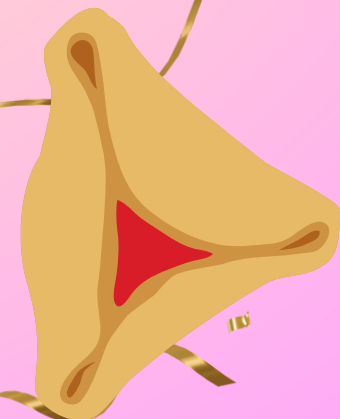
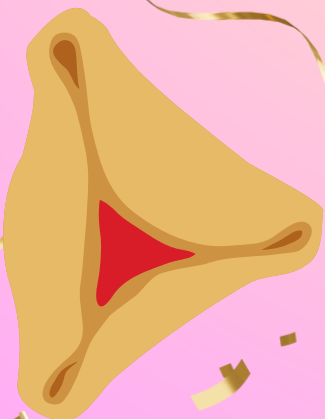

## TREE OF LIFE

The Tree of Life sculpture was created by the renowned synagogue artist Sanford Werfel. The branches of the tree form the Hebrew words "Etz Chaim." The stones at the roots of the Tree are symbolic of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. The golden leaves and stones may be inscribed to highlight or commemorate joyous occasions, including births, weddings, anniversaries, graduations or to honor family, parents or friends. Cost: \$175 to inscribe a leaf and \$1,000 to inscribe a stone.

**Brotherhood Fund:** The Brotherhood at Temple Sinai provides services to the Temple through Jewish men by promoting a sense of fellowship and camaraderie among its membership. Brotherhood fosters education, social and cultural understanding; all men are welcome to join us at any event throughout the year. Helps support the IST scholarship program.

**Building Maintenance Fund:** This fund supports the physical demands of our brick and mortar structure. It allows us to make repairs and improvements for a more secure, functioning and beautiful Temple for all who enter our doors.

**Cantorial Fund:** To support the cantorial services, including concerts for the Temple.

**Cohen Family B'nei Mitzvah Chumash Fund:** Each Bar/Bat Mitzvah should receive their own Chumash. Once the principal is high enough to sustain the gifts, it can no longer be invaded. A book plate will be placed in each book.

**Cushman Neal Family Wellness Fund:** To provide health and mental wellness programs.

**Daniel Aaron Lipson Memorial IST Scholarship:** Grants \$1,000 to two Temple Sinai IST participants each year. The scholarship is a needs-based award.

**Doron Abosch Memorial Fund:** For the maintenance of the grand piano and to support the annual concert.

**Eber Cultural Arts Fund:** To promote and underwrite cultural programs such as films, performers and speakers.

**General Fund:** To provide additional funding for the operations of the Temple.

**Haag Family Assistance Fund:** To help congregants in extreme need of basic food and other essentials.

**Ida & Max Fogel Windows of the World Fund:** To purchase Jewish books and media and to endow library staffing.

**Ilene Shiroff Memorial Fund:** For the planting and maintenance of the flower garden.

**Jeffrey O. Rosenberg Memorial Scholarship Fund:** To provide textbooks and other course materials for Temple Sinai members enrolled in higher education Jewish study courses and rabbinic studies and to provide B'nei mitzvah tutoring for families in need.

**Jewish Education Fund:** To provide opportunities for children to go to Israel on a program and to subsidize scholars for discussion groups on Israel and other Jewish matters. The fund also helps bring in guest speakers, affords scholars-in-residence and hosts programs at little to no cost to the congregation.

**Julius & Helen Ring Israel Teen Scholarship Fund:** To underwrite a portion of the community Israel Study Tour (IST) and to provide funds for our youth traveling to Israel on recognized programs.

**Marilyn Tobin Memorial Flower Fund:** To provide pulpit flowers for worship services.

**Osi and Selma Sladek Cultural Arts/Music Fund:** To support cultural and musical events at Temple Sinai.

**Prayer Book Fund:** For Shabbat and High Holy Days prayerbooks.

**Preschool Underwriting Fund:** To support preschool operations.

**Rabbi Richard Rheins Discretionary Fund:** To provide unbudgeted items and programs which the Rabbi designates for the Temple, to help the needy in our midst, and/or to support various local and Jewish charities.

**Rabbi Michael Shields Discretionary Fund:** To provide unbudgeted items and programs which the Rabbi designates for the Temple, to help the needy in our midst, and/or to support various local and Jewish charities.

**Rabbi Zwerin Discretionary Fund:** To perpetuate the future of Temple Sinai and to honor the contributions of Rabbi Zwerin.

**Religious School Fund:** To provide scholarship funds for our teachers to attend educational conferences, workshops and courses which will enhance Religious School. Also to provide scholarships for children in Religious School.

**Robin's World Playground Fund:** To provide upkeep and expansion of the playground and outdoor learning spaces.

**Teacher Education Fund:** To help subsidize workshops or conventions for teachers in both Religious School and Preschool.

**We Care/Social Action Fund:** Works to reach out to our congregants in their moments of need and celebration. This fund also supports all of Temple Sinai's Social Action and Social Justice programs and allows us to make a significant difference in our community.

**Women's Programming Initiative:** The mission of Women at Temple Sinai is to support women in our congregation. The programs provide social, educational and fun experiences.

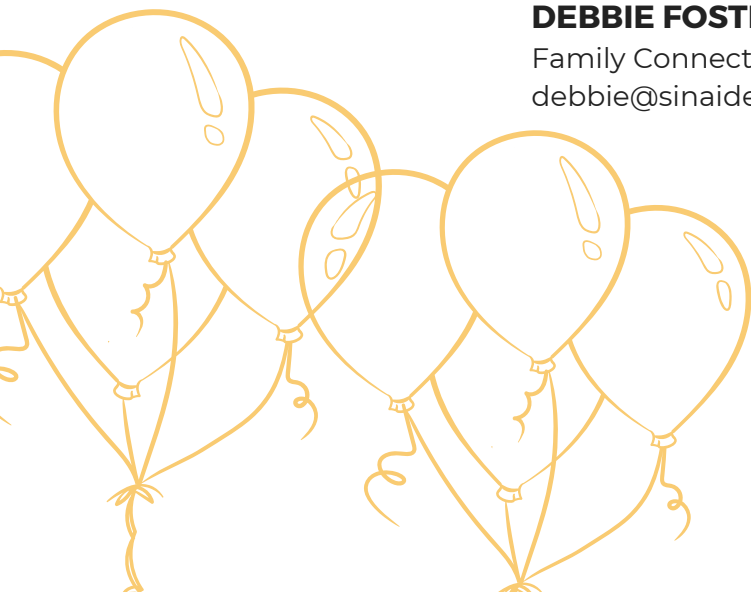
