A MOMENT OF REFLECTION

As we stand on the cusp of a new fiscal year, it's a poignant moment to reflect on the journey we've collectively undertaken and the milestones we've achieved. The past year has been one of growth, unity, and connection at Temple Sinai. I am filled with gratitude for each and every one of you who has contributed to our shared vision, commitment and innovation. Your active participation and enthusiasm have been the heartbeat of our congregation. Over the past year, several moments stand out as a testament to our congregation's commitment to communal, financial and spiritual sustainability.

Our congregation is growing and thriving due to our collaborative efforts to create a welcoming and inclusive environment for all. Since July of 2023, Temple Sinai has welcomed 67 new households and implemented an Ambassador Program that pairs new households with a board member to serve as their buddies.

Our amazing preschool finished the year with 159 students while our exceptional Religious School continues to grow and completed the year with more than 230 students. We engaged Young Families and created our monthly Twisted Shabbat program that continues to thrive. With 200 people attending the event in May. We want to extend a **special thank you to Diana Kaplan** for making all the Challah Dough throughout the year.

Light the Night, our huge Chanukah celebration brought together our synagogue and preschool, and we dedicated our beautiful new outdoor space. We re-launched our Sisterhood with a fabulous Bunco kick-off event with over 60 women in attendance. In addition, Sinai Social was created to provide social programming for congregants 50 and older. Sinai Social had two successful events including a brunch at the Landmark and a Wine and Root Beer Tasting. At the end of June, the group will sponsor a road rally followed by dinner

at the Temple. After a 15 year hiatus, we brought back Mitzvah Day, reaching out to seven organizations in our greater Denver community. Book your calendars for Mitzvah Day 2024 on Sunday, September 8.

A special shout out to **Nancy Eisenberg and our Caring Community, our Brotherhood Board led by Jon Levison and Marty Meitus and our LifeLong Jewish Learning committee for all that you do** and the special programming you've created throughout the past year. **A big thank you to Shana Cohen for building our community of Chavurot.**

With the rise of antisemitism both globally and locally, we are reminded of the hatred and prejudice that continues to plague our world. In times like these, let us not forget the resilience and strength that lies within our community and we must come together in solidarity, support, and action. We sponsored two major programs this past year with **invaluable help from Terri Tilliss and Jon Falk to help fight antisemitism.** In October, 180 people attended *Defeating Anti-Semitism* with Tina Malka from Hillel International. On May 29, over 250 Temple Sinai and community members attended a program *Help Deflate Jew Hate. Yes, You! Tools for standing up to anti-Zionism (A form of Antisemitism)*. This program was co-sponsored by Temple Sinai and Jewish National Fund-USA.

One of the biggest highlights of this past year was our *Chai Five Campaign* - the High Holy Days to Chanukah Appeal. Through the generosity of all of you as well as a \$25,000 donor match, the Temple raised \$52,414 to help underwrite programs for families, empty nesters and adult education. This year's Annual Event, Shine a Light on Temple Sinai, **honored all of you.** With 200 people in attendance the event raised over \$116,000.

Temple Sinai secured a \$550,000 grant from the City of Denver that will allow us to make our building more green by installing solar in the next six months.

We will begin phase two of our outdoor space. Money raised from this past years Annual Event and Jewish Colorado Gives Day will allow us to create a space outdoors for our older kids. We are beginning the planning stages and hope to include barbeques, a basketball hoop and a permanent gaga pit.

Due to Temple Sinai's outstanding fiscal position, the Board of Trustees decided not to implement a dues increase for this upcoming year.

As of June 1, 2024 we are finally fully staffed. Kelsey Oliver, who serves as our Office Manager, began on January 6, 2024, after spending 15 years at the preschool. Debbie Foster joins us as Director of Engagement and Programming. Debbie is a longtime employee, having spent the last four years teaching at the preschool. Her primary focus will be inventing new ways to increase congregational engagement through programs and connection while continuing to implement our already successful events.

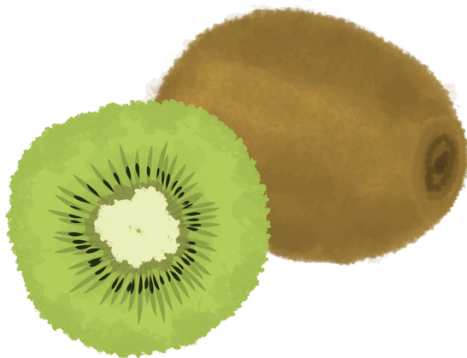

Since October 7, we have been through such a stressful and agonizing period that it has taken a toll on the Jewish community both physically and emotionally.

I am so proud of the way our community has responded to the increase of antisemitism and anti-Zionism that we have witnessed around the world and even in our backyards. We have seen anger and vitriol poured out against Jews and Israel. We have seen our children, students in middle schools, high schools, and colleges subjected to twisted pro-Hamas narratives and hysterical rantings by those who call both for the destruction of Israel and America. We are bombarded by slanted coverage in the news media that often repeats verbatim with screaming headlines propaganda from Hamas operatives, only to bury the “correction” of the falsehoods days later in small print.

"SEE YOU AT SINAI!" RABBI MICHAEL SHIELDS

Shavuot is coming and I am a Rabbi of Temple Sinai, so this is how I sometimes end my emails or conversations with you. We stand together at Sinai, and we stand strong and resilient. Rabbi Rheins writes eloquently of this in his Keshet article this month. We also stand at Sinai because of Shavuot. We stand at Sinai to receive.

We've been counting the 49 days to Shavuot ever since the second night of Pesach, and soon that Omer journey will be complete. We will again have made that great spiritual trek from freedom to revelation, from Pesach's new beginning to the covenantal relationship with God that we entered into at Sinai and renew each year at this time.

It's a relationship that we continue to take on. No relationship can be sustained with one moment of agreement. Our covenant with God is evolving and ongoing, as our relationship with God needs to be evolving and ongoing.

Our relationship with Torah is ongoing as well. Shavuot is called "Zman mattan Torateinu, "The time of the giving of our Torah." Not the time when it was given, but the time when it is given.

Torah is still being given. We witness this every time a b'nei mitzvah offers a sermon on a Saturday morning, or when we share wisdom at the Lunch and Learn table on Thursday afternoons.

Revelation is ongoing -- as some of the great kabbalists taught, God's message, the divine broadcast if you will, is ongoing, and when our spiritual radios are attuned we are able to receive that Torah.

Shavuot, and in fact, the time from Shavuot until Rosh Hashanah is a special time of opening ourselves to receive what's coming through. We must make good use of that time and engage in Torah, in community, in Israel.

Midrash teaches that we were all present at Sinai. All of our souls were at Sinai for that experience of connection with our Source: every Jew who has ever been and will ever be. We were all there at Sinai in that sacred moment.

And we will stand together at Sinai again on Shavuot. On Shavuot we can seek to open ourselves to this year's revelation, to the wisdom that this moment asks of us. We all can gather on Shavuot and throughout the year here at Temple Sinai and maybe imagine being together in the Wilderness, Bamidbar, at the foot of that same mountain.

So I hope to see you this Shavuot and throughout the summer. As our Omer journey ends, our covenant with the Holy is renewed, and we begin another journey towards the New Year and the High Holy Days.

As we open ourselves to the Torah that we need in the months upcoming, may we be open to transformation, encounters with holiness, and awe. As we gather at Sinai, may we find the warmth of community and delicious words of Torah, sweet and sustaining like milk and honey.

See you at Sinai.

DIRECTOR OF PROGRAMMING AND ENGAGEMENT

I am beyond thrilled to join the professional staff at Temple Sinai! People might think that because Foster is my last name, my connection is only with Temple Emanuel, my dad being a Rabbi there for over 50 years. But that is not the case at all! Rabbi Zwerin, Rikki, Robin, Ron and Dina each played a pivotal role in my life. When I was little, the Fosters and the Zwerins would share Shabbat dinner together at least once a year before the annual “Sinai/Emanuel” Friday night service. We ate Rikki’s delicious food and I listened to my Grandma Beverly and Rikki talk about sewing.

I remember going to the Zwerins’ home for Robin’s shiva – it’s one of my first memories of a community enveloping their Rabbi and family with love. Robin’s Playground Sign was the very first thing I saw when I walked into Temple Sinai preschool four years ago when I was hired to teach Pre-K. Dina was my CIT at Shwayder and would stay with me when my parents were out of town in my teens. Ron grew up with my brothers, David and Danny. In my 30s, Ron helped me develop my first website when I tried to start a Jewish cooking business after being a finalist in the National Manishevitz cooking competition.

The old Temple Sinai building was also the home to Theodore Herzl Jewish Day School – “Herzl” (now part of DJDS). I walked into Temple Sinai everyday in 1st and 2nd Grade – I vividly remember the Ark. Super retro.

Like many Jewish kids in the '80s and '90s, I spent my summers at Shwayder Camp and was really involved in Youth Group. We had “Shul-ins” at Emanuel and Sinai – making lifelong friends from both synagogues.

Celebrating Shabbat, Day School, Camp, Youth Group, teaching in Jewish Schools – all these experiences led to my strong Jewish identity and feelings of safety in the Jewish world. My deepest desire is to help others feel that sense of connection and safety.

My new title as Director of Engagement and Programming perfectly encompasses my strengths. Engagement is a verb – it’s the act of making meaningful connections and envisioning/learning how people want to connect. Programming is the noun – it is what is created using that vision as a guide. I’m both a visionary and an implementer – and whether you’re 3 or 83, I want to know you and help create meaningful moments with you.

Lastly, because I didn’t grow up at Temple Sinai, I have a lot to learn and experience in our special community. I have people to meet and names to learn. I have questions about your relationship with Temple; what shouldn't change and what new ideas you can help envision. I can’t do this job alone. A synagogue is a sacred place because we do things together – pray, play, practice Mitzvot, socialize, learn, teach and of course eat!

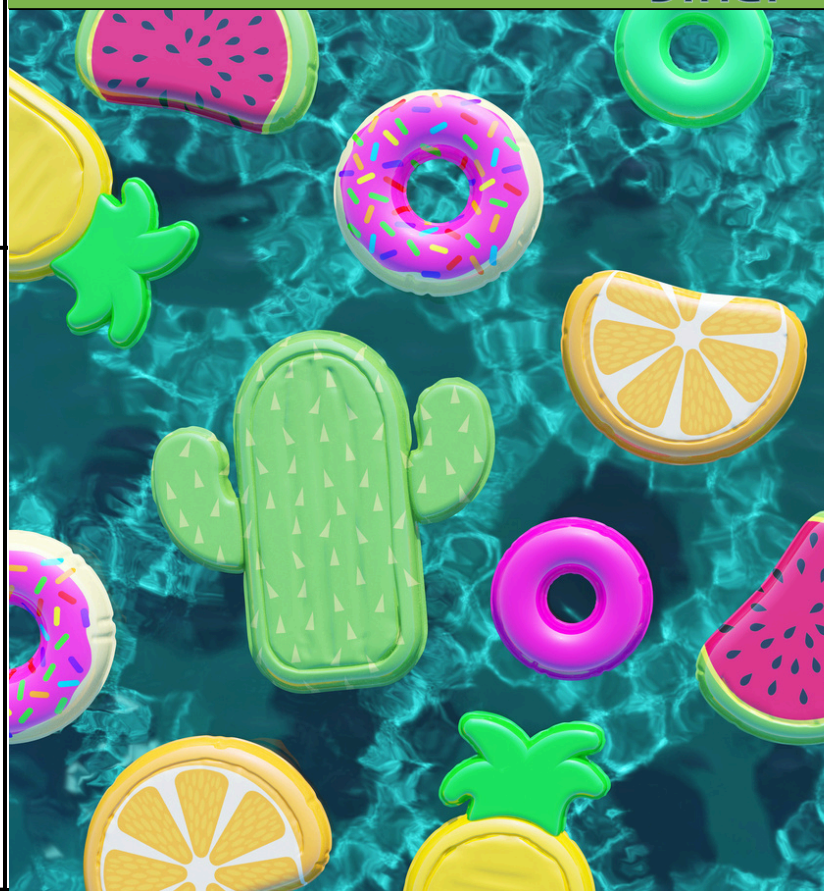

Originally, the three Festivals were called Sh'losh Regalim, the "Three Pilgrimages." Our ancestors would travel from all over to gather in Jerusalem for the sacred services. There, they would bring their offerings, renew their communal bonds, listen to the Psalms of Hallel, and honor the memories of their loved ones. Though the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed nearly two-thousand years ago, Jews have continued to keep alive those Biblical traditions.

During the Yizkor service we read the names of all our loved ones who died during the past year. We also pause and honor the memories of those who blessed our lives and whose legacies we cherish and preserve.

The powerful experiences of our ancestral Festivals help us rekindle faith and perpetuate the loving memory of our loved ones. Come to the Shavuot service and discover the gifts and inspiration of Judaism. Study and prayer, socializing and song, remembrance and renewal express the true essence of Shavuot.

As an expression of Jewish community unity, Temple Sinai and HEA (Hebrew Education Alliance) will join together for our Erev Shavuot Tikkun Leil and Festival service. This year's evening observance will be hosted by HEA.

BRICK-BY-BRICK PROJECT

WALL OF REMEMBRANCE

The Wall of Remembrance, located outside the Zwerin Sanctuary, is a way to memorialize the passing of a loved one. Name plates are inscribed with the name of the departed along with the English and Hebrew date of death. Cost: \$350.



TREE OF LIFE

The Tree of Life sculpture was created by the renowned synagogue artist Sanford Werfel. The branches of the tree form the Hebrew words "Etz Chaim." The stones at the roots of the Tree are symbolic of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. The golden leaves and stones may be inscribed to highlight or commemorate joyous occasions, including births, weddings, anniversaries, graduations or to honor family, parents or friends. Cost: \$175 to inscribe a leaf and \$1,000 to inscribe a stone.

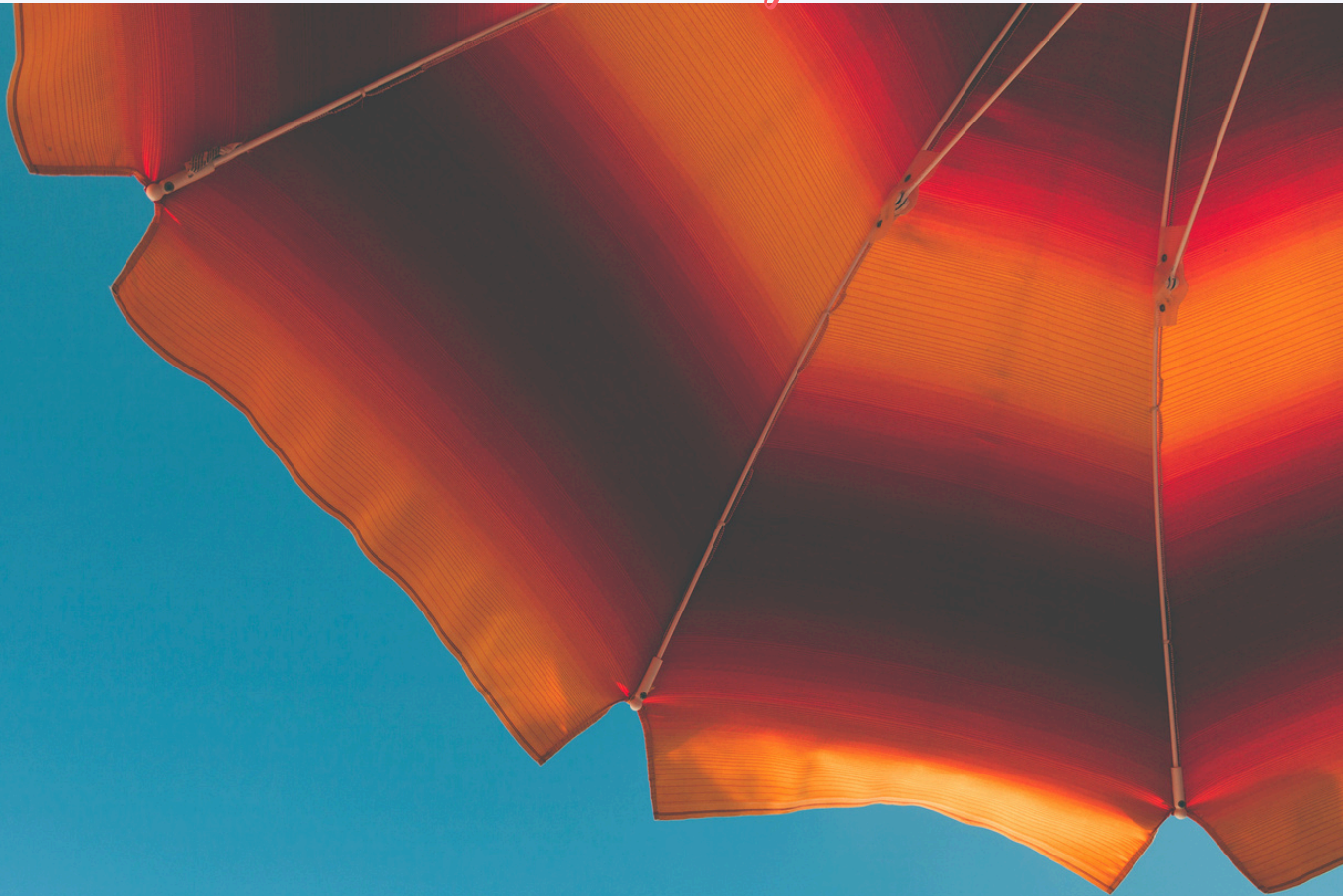

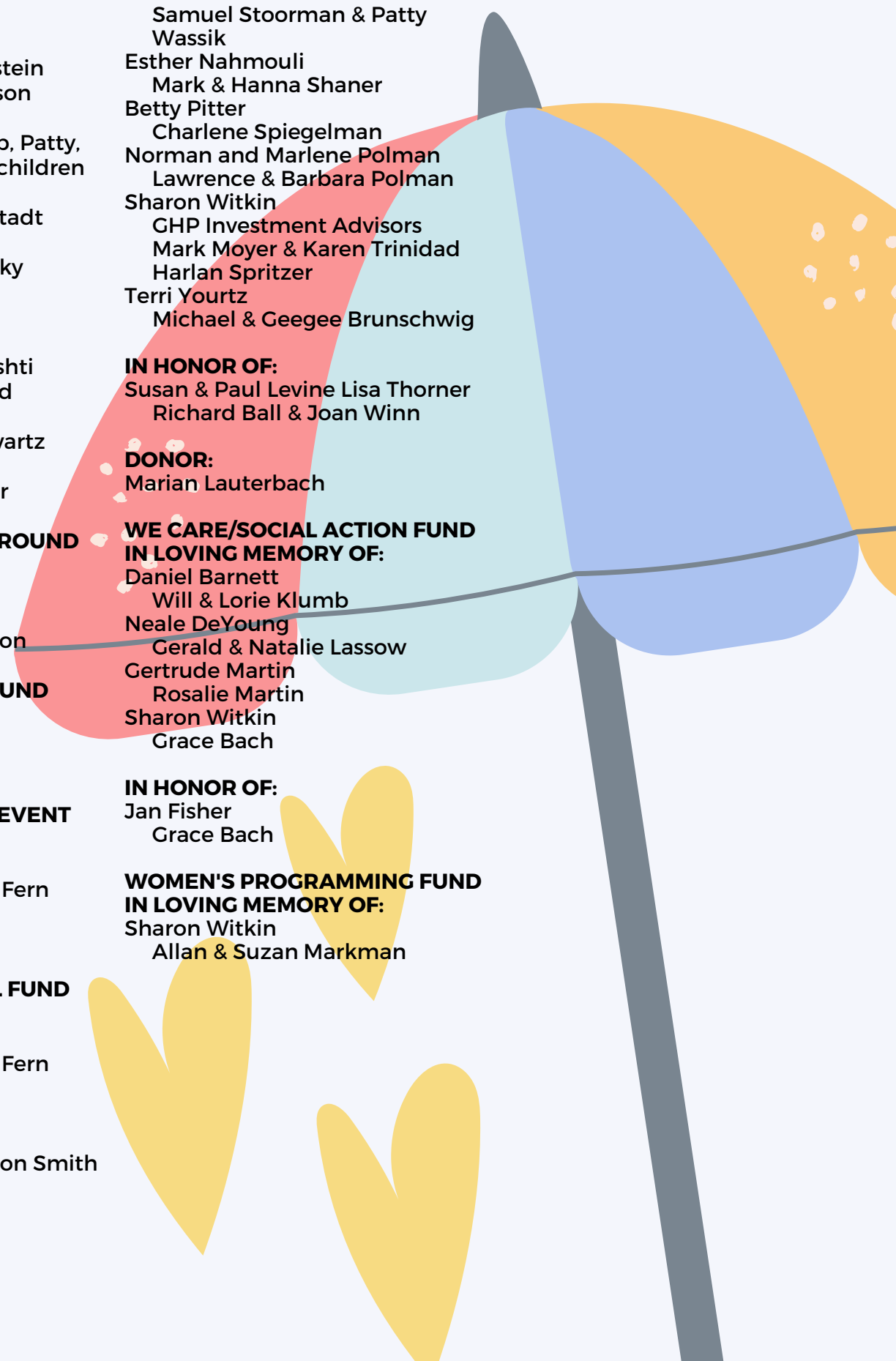
