AGAINST ALL ODDS? ISRAEL'S 78TH BIRTHDAY IS A MIRACLE AND A MITZVAH RABBI RICK RHEINS

As you know, this is the year we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the United States and our Declaration of Independence from Great Britain in 1776. And this also is the year we proudly note the 150th anniversary of Colorado's declaration of statehood in 1876. With so much attention rightly given to the significant milestones of our nation and state, I want to add a plea that we not overlook the birthday of Israel. Yom HaAtzma'ut, Israel's declaration of independence from Great Britain, is observed on May 14, 1948, which corresponds to the Hebrew date of 5 Iyar. (Note that the 5th of Iyar falls this year falls on April 21-22).

From its birth, the modern state of Israel has faced hostile neighbors and existential challenges. And yet, it has not merely survived these past 78 years; it has thrived and grown into one of this world's great democracies. The Jewish State of Israel gave refuge to Jews from European, African, and Arab countries that had persecuted and oppressed Jews for centuries. Israel welcomed our Jewish brothers and sisters when they had absolutely nothing and helped to transform us so that once again we could fulfill God's promise to break the yoke of oppression and to guide us to walk upright and proud in our land (Leviticus 26:13).

Yes, one can confidently describe the creation of modern Israel as a miracle. For over 1,900 years, the majority of Jews were forced to live in exile. While a small remnant continued to live under the harshest of conditions in our ancestral homeland, Jews in the Diaspora kept our connections to Israel through prayers; the expression "Next Year in Jerusalem" was an ever-present part of our gatherings. For centuries, Jews faced murderous pogroms, oppression, humiliation, and slaughter in Europe and the Middle East. Well before the Holocaust, Jews around the world began to realize the necessity of a return to Zion in order to reestablish an independent Israel for our safety and well-being. Wise men and world leaders scoffed at the idea of Zionism. Many Jews also initially resisted the idea, fearing that we would be accused of "dual-loyalties" and jeopardize the delicate veneer of "assimilated acceptance" that provided some security.

Throughout our long history we have learned that while God's miracles provide opportunities, it is up to us to perform the mitzvah. It took brave and principled men and women to organize a return to Zion. It took generous, hardworking, and idealistic people to purchase the land, to drain the swamps, to irrigate the

desert, to plant the trees, and to build the towns, villages, kibbutzim, and cities of modern Israel.

Against all odds? Perhaps. But miracles and mitzvot turn dreams into realities. It goes without saying that from her birth, modern Israel has faced unrelenting threats and opposition from her neighbors and from the descendants of the old tribes of antisemites and bigots who plague every generation. Some who seek to destroy Israel and attack the Jewish people are neo-Nazis; some are afflicted with the self-righteous arrogance of radical chic; some are sadly ignorant and easy marks for conspiracy creeps on the dark web; some are lost simpletons manipulated by rogue professors, professional campus agitators, and hired thugs. Those who are filled with hatred for Jews and Israel are probably a lost cause. But our mitzvah, our sacred duty to protect one another, requires us to be better informed. Unless we can better articulate the blessings of Judaism and Israel, we will find an erosion of our faith and family.

To help us, Temple Sinai is proud to host an evening with Eylon Levy. From October 7, 2023 and throughout most of the war against Hamas and Hezbollah, the Israeli spokesperson who was the most eloquent and effective was Eylon Levy. He attended University of Oxford, where he received his Bachelor's degree in Philosophy, Politics, and Economics in 2013. He received his Master's degree in International Relations from the University of Cambridge. Suffice it to say that, Eylon is whip smart, funny, engaging, and by far the best advocate for Israel in the English-speaking world. He continues his public advocacy work, with a podcast partly sponsored by the Ministry of Diaspora Affairs and Combating Antisemitism. I encourage you to check out some of Eylon's videos on YouTube.

Eylon Levy will speak at Temple Sinai on Thursday, May 28, to inform and inspire us. To help cover the cost of the program, there is a modest fee (\$15 for Sinai members and \$25 for non-members. Students with school identification are admitted free.). Registration is required to ensure a safe and secure experience.

Modern Israel and the welfare of the Jewish people are both miracles and mitzvot. We should never take for granted that we live in an era with a strong and independent Jewish nation. Let us celebrate her birthday by strengthening our bonds to our ancestral homeland and to each other.

Becoming Who We Are Meant to Be: B'nei Mitzvah at Temple Sinai

From the very bottom of my heart, I want to begin with gratitude. Thank you for making Temple Sinai your family's spiritual home. It is a sacred privilege to walk alongside your children and your families at such a meaningful moment in your lives.

At Temple Sinai, each student is honored and treasured for who they are. No two learners are the same, and we take that seriously. We recognize that each student learns differently, grows differently, and connects differently. Our role is not to force a single mold, but to meet each child where they are and help them discover how Judaism can speak to them in a way that is authentic, substantial, and personal.

This year, I have the added blessing of experiencing this journey not only as a rabbi, but as a parent of a Bar Mitzvah. Sitting on the other side, watching my own child prepare, struggle, grow, and step into this moment, has deepened my appreciation for just how powerful and emotional this process is. I feel the same pride, the same nerves, the same hope that you do. It has reminded me in a very personal way that this is not just about mastering prayers or delivering a speech. It is about witnessing our children become who they are meant to be, and about families marking that transformation together in a sacred and lasting way.

Because of that, our approach to B'nei Mitzvah is not about checking boxes or cramming information. It is about cultivating a relationship with Jewish tradition, with community, and with one's own emerging identity. Becoming a Bar or Bat Mitzvah is not a finish line. It is a beginning. It marks the start of a lifelong Jewish journey filled with curiosity, meaning, and growth.

There is a beautiful teaching in Pirkei Avot, where Rabbi Shimon HaTzadik teaches: *"The world stands on three things: Torah, prayer, and acts of human kindness."* These three pillars, Torah, Avodah (prayer), and Gemilut Chasadim (acts of kindness), form the heart of any B'nei Mitzvah experience.

Each student engages deeply with Torah, not only learning to chant from it, but to wrestle with it, question it, and ultimately teach it. They explore prayer, discovering both the structure and the spirit of Jewish worship, and gain the skills and confidence to lead our community. And they embrace Tikkun Olam, acts of repair and responsibility, learning that Judaism calls us not only to study and pray, but to act with compassion in the world.

Through this process, our hope is simple but profound: that each student fills their mind with knowledge, their soul with spirituality, and their heart with love.

Just as each child is unique, so too is each B'nei Mitzvah service. We work closely with every family to create an experience that reflects who they are. We listen carefully, we adapt thoughtfully, and we strive to ensure that every family member feels respected, included, and able to celebrate fully. Our goal is for each student to shine in their own way, not by fitting into a template, but by bringing their authentic self to the bimah.

Along the way, something else beautiful happens. Relationships deepen. Bonds are formed between rabbis, students, and families. Conversations emerge between a young person's passions and the enduring wisdom of our tradition. These are not incidental moments, they are the heart of the journey.

Truly, one of the greatest joys of being a rabbi is guiding students as they step into this next chapter of Jewish life. B'nei Mitzvah is not just a milestone to be celebrated, it is a doorway into a richer, more connected Jewish future. And we are deeply grateful to walk through that doorway together, with you, and with your children.

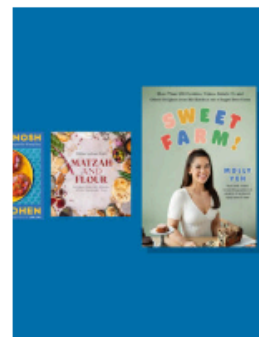

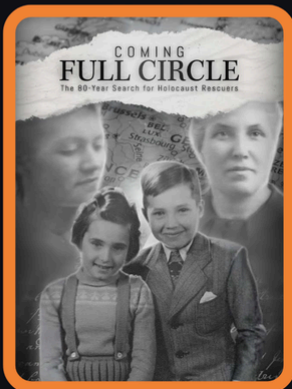

This powerful documentary tells the story of siblings Zilla and Eric Cahn who were rescued as children from the Gurs internment camp in France during WWII and hidden by the French Resistance during the war. Decades later, they embark on a journey to find those who saved them, uncovering a story of survival, gratitude, and reunion.

Zilla and Eric Cahn both settled in Denver after the war, where Zilla later married Temple Sinai founding member Abe Wagner. Temple Emanuel shares a powerful connection as well, with a Haggadah created at Gurs that survived the Holocaust and is still used at their Passover Seder today.
